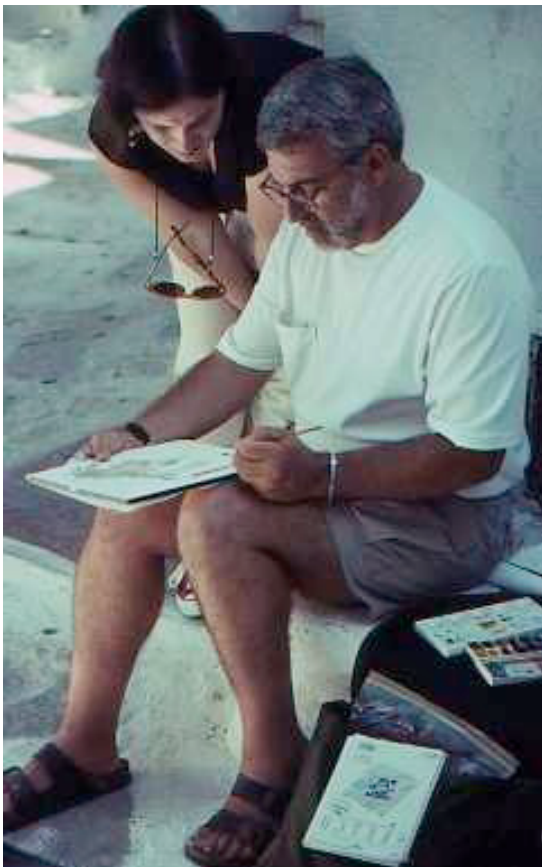
The College's Study Abroad program, currently situated in Orvieto, Italy, reflects our internationalism focus in action. The program provides an incredible educational enterprise – one that is designed to enhance knowledge, challenge the boundaries of global design



education, and engage students in appreciation of international systems significantly different from their own. Previous destinations included Greece, while future locations planned include Mexico, Latin America and Asia.

The Study Abroad program encompasses a summer session of two classes, with groups typically including ten students led by one or two faculty members. One class, Architecture Design, incorporates drawing, collage, and watercolor and is used to develop an understanding of architectural principles in the city and in buildings. The second, Architecture Special Project, employs the travel journal as a tool to investigate and record new cultural and architectural experiences.





Continued growth of this important international program depends on the generosity of friends committed to the critical role of high design education standards in the quest for global sustainability. Architecture Study in Italy

CALA's summer program in the Mediterranean comprises five weeks of study based in the city of Orvieto, Italy, a fascinating city occupied continuously since Etruscan times. Side trips to Florence, Rome, Siena, Pompeii and other historic locations are also included in the program.

Curriculum

'Architecture in the Mediterranean' incorporates drawing, collage and watercolor to develop an understanding of architectural principles in the city and in buildings. The focus is on observation, description and analysis. This course fulfills the School of Architecture upper division design communications requirement.

'Special Project in Architecture' employs the travel journal as a tool to investigate and record new cultural and architectural experiences. Students are challenged to integrate writing and images into a cohesive and meaningful document.

Director

The superior quality of this experience can only be measured by the strength of a outstanding faculty. Director and Professor Mary Hardin began teaching in the School of Architecture at the University of Texas at Austin in 1983, and also taught at Arizona State University before joining the University of Arizona faculty in 1997. She has led previous study abroad programs at Arizona State University, and has traveled extensively throughout Europe. She has been involved with the College of Architecture and Landscape Architecture's Architecture Study in Italy program since 2002.

Architecture Study in Italy – Orvieto Details

ARC 481E/581E: ARCHITECTURE IN THE MEDITERRANEAN (3 CREDITS)

ARC 497B/597B: SPECIAL PROJECT IN ARCHITECTURE (3 CREDITS)

The center of study for the program is located in the central town square of Orvieto, and faces a 14th century Cathedral considered to be one of Italy's greatest artistic treasures. Classrooms and computer labs are housed in a three-story building that was a hospital, built in the 14th century, remodeled in the 19th century, and converted to an institute and headquarters for the Orvieto Civic Foundation in 2001-2002. The building has a central block and two flanking wings enfolding a spacious, private, gated garden. It is located near the train station from where hourly trains reach Rome in just 60 minutes. Student housing is located in the historical district in Orvieto. There is a home-stay option for students interested in living with an Italian family.
